### 3.0 FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF EXTERNAL VALIDATION PANEL

## 3.1 Main Findings

The External Validation Panel of Assessors recommends approval of the proposed

#### 3.3 Recommendations

- 3.3.1 Develop a guidance document for Students for the 30 ECTS Credit Module *Outline Business Plan*. This should include appropriate guidance on the characteristics of the main deliverables including structure, word counts and level of research, inter alia, as appropriate.
- 3.3.2 Make more explicit in the programme documentation and in the modules the learning associated with the following:
  - grant funding applications and associated skill development;
  - sustainability and resilience;
  - IP and copyright;
  - export and e-commerce;
  - costings;
  - writing skills.

Include as appropriate in learning outcomes, indicative content and assessment strategies.

- 3.3.3 Make more explicit in the programme the evolution of the role of the Entrepreneur. Review and revise the reading list to include further references relating to *Entrepreneurship as a Designer*.
- 3.3.4 Ensure that programme content is both national and international in outlook and contexts, as appropriate, and does not overly rely on the Irish context only.

- 3.3.5 Add further reading/references on *Writing a Business Plan* to relevant modules as appropriate.
- 3.3.6 Continue the use of Guest Lecturers which is very important in supporting diverse perspectives at postgraduate level.
- 3.3.7 Further consider what mentoring and supports can be provided to students during the programme and the level of follow up and support that could be offered to students once they graduate.

### 3.4 Commendations and Observations

- 3.4.1 The panel commends the LSAD, Department of Design/Flexible Learning and the Programme team for the development of a further innovative offering that adds to the programme suite at Masters level providing progression and learning opportunities in the cognate area.
- 3.4.2 The panel welcomes the Springboard funding that supports the programme and also notes the strategy to mainstream and secure the programme in the longer term.
- 3.4.3 The panel commends the partnership and collaboration between the Departments of Design, Flexible Learning and the Enterprise and Acceleration Centre in the design and development of the programme.
- 3.4.4 The panel commends the comprehensive and robust documentation and notes the hard work of the team to get it to that level.
- 3.4.5 The panel commends the blended learning approach which supports programme access and assists in creating life-long learning opportunities.
- 3.4.6 The panel notes and commends the holistic skills mix and creative expertise of the Programme Team. The panel notes the very strong practice based dimension to this expertise.
- 3.4.7 The panel commends the evident enthusiasm and passion of the programme team and thanks the team for the open and constructive engagement during the validation visit.
