3.0 FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF EXTERNAL VALIDATION PANEL

3.1 Main Findings

The External Validation Panel of Assessors recommends approval of the proposed *Bachelor of Laws (Honours) in Law* (Level 8) and embedded *Bachelor of Arts in Legal Studies* (Exit Award at Level 7).

3.2 Conditions

3.3 Recommendations

- 1) Ensure that there is adequate resourcing for the staff expertise and workload required to support the programme.
- 2) Review the level of elective choice and how the electives work in practice (scope of choice, resourcing and learner numbers, prerequisites, alignment of elective pathways with Programme Learning Outcomes). Consider making some of the electives created specifically for this programme mandatory (e.g. Stage 1 Module, *Innovation Entrepreneurship and Law*).
- 3) Communicate clearly to students about their elective pathways and choices and the impact of choosing particular modules during the early Stages of the programme on their options at a later Stage. Develop appropriate graphics to support this.
- 4) Specify the pre-requisites required depending on which electives are chosen in the earlier stages of the programme.
- 5) Explore, at institutional level, if there is scope for offering Electives across the NFQ levels.
- 6) Reconsider strongly the inclusion of a language elective in the programme. If a language is retained, include reference to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) to clarify the level of language provision.
- 7) Clarify in the programme document that approval is not currently being sought for an Erasmus element as part of this programme approval. Remove reference to Erasmus on confirmation of this.


8) Consider how employers and students can be supported before and during Placement and further develop guidance and training as appropriate.

9) Amend the wording of the statement in the curriculum document with respect to eligibility of graduates to apply for examinations of the Law Society (Page 8) to reflect eligibility prior to graduation.

3.4 Commendations and Observations

The panel commends the team for developing an excellent and innovative programme.
The strong emphasis on the development of transversal skills is particularly noteworthy and strongly commended.

- 2) The panel commends the support of the *Access* agenda and provision of an offering that can widen access participation in law programmes in the region and nationally.
- 3) The panel commends the Workplacement and its management and particularly noted the appropriateness of the Preparation for Placement Module and preparation for working in a professional practice environment.
- 4) The panel commends the approach taken to teaching, learning and assessment and the emphasis on graduate attributes. The use of innovative and cross modular assessment is also noteworthy.
- 5) The panel commends the quality of the programme submission and documentation and noted its comprehensive and detailed nature.
- 6) The panel commends the positive and collegiate engagement of the programme team during the validation visit.
