3.0 FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF EXTERNAL VALIDATION PANEL

3.1 Main Findings

The External Validation Panel of Assessors recommends approval of the proposed:

- Master of Arts in Social Work (Full-time),
- Master of Arts in Social Work (Part-time)
- Postgraduate Diploma in Arts in Social Sciences,

subject to the Recommendation as specified in Section 3.3.

The panel note an excellent programme presentation as reflected in the commendations.

 Consider aligning the independent learning hours to be specified as either per Module or per Week to provide consistency in the Approved Programme Schedule.

3.4 Commendations and Observations

The Panel commend:

- 1) the evident strategic focus and compelling rationale of the programme, fulfilling regional needs and aligned with TUS strategy;
- 2) the creation of an important progression pathway for prospective students including for undergraduate students and employees of the sector, particularly noting the Full-time, Part-time options and the embedded Postgraduate Diploma;
- 3) the excellent programme documentation which is detailed, comprehensive and developed to a very high standard;
- 4) the evident care and attention to detail in the development of the programme including:
 - a) the focus on pedagogies of care including the emphasis on wellbeing, resilience and social justice as integral themes and the creation of a community of learners approach;
 - b) innovative pedagogy integrated throughout the programme, particularly noting the benefits of simulation learning;

- c) clear alignment with the TUS Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy including the emphasis on the development of soft skills that support the wider graduate attributes
- 5) the significant engagement and consultation with external stakeholders such as the HSE, TUSLA, and Placement Providers including the voluntary sector;
- 6) the consultation and engagement with CORU, the foresight of the programme team in aligning with CORU requirements and the associated mapping exercises as part of programme development;
- 7) the consideration given to the wider context of students and the reduction of potential barriers to participation as part of programme design;
- 8) the extensive expertise and experience of the programme team, both academic and in practice;
- 9) the positive engagement, enthusiasm, dedication, and team spirit exhibited by the programme team during the validation visit.
