3. FINDINGS, CONDITIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

3.1 Main Findings

The External Validation Panel of Assessors recommends reapproval of the Higher Certificate in Dental Nursing programme subject to the conditions and recommendations as specified in Sections 3.2 and 3.3.

3.2 Condition(s)

1) Provide evidence of the mapping of the programme to the Irish Dental Council's Dental Nursing Scope of Practice in the documentation.

3.3 Recommendations

- 1) Consider reviewing placement opportunities in semester 1. For example, introducing real-life scenarios (with dentists/patients) in a laboratory setting.
- 2) Create a documented protocol for assisting non-performing students on clinical placement.
- 3) Provide a rationale for the programme/module changes in the documentation.
- 4) Include an updated ACS for the proposed programme.
- 5) Include the supporting programme quantitative data and analysis on the programme since the last programme review. For example, minimum CAO points, pass rates, progression, employment data etc.
- 6) Check documentation for correctness and consistency.
- 7) Review and update references and reading lists where appropriate.
- 8) Change wording of learning outcomes (for example, the use of "appreciate" in Clinical Dentistry II and III).
- 9) Review LO3 in relation to quantitative appraisal tools. Ensure that the indicative syllabus takes care of this. (Dental Research).
- 10) Review the language used around professional conduct (for example, the use of "honour").
- 11)Consider including more practical training relating to vulnerable patients in the programme.
- 12) Consider enhancing the communications skills training within the programme.
- 13) Consider the weighting of the Dental Practice Management module assessment.

14)Review the failed element/synoptic assessments within modules with due consideration to student progression.

15)Reword section on page 6 on the progression of students as it could be

interpreted that progression is to L7 in the UK.

16)Investigate the possibility of promoting Dental Nursing further as a career as opposed to a stepping stone to other programmes.

3.4 Commendations

1) The panel commends the programme team on the support given to students on

an on-going basis.

2) The panel commends high quality student output as demonstrated by clinical

placement providers.

3) The alumni and students spoke positively of their educational experience.

4) The panel commends the positive and collegiate engagement of the programme

team during the validation visit.
