5. Declaration of Conflicts of Interest & Loyalty

6. Correspondence

Approval was given by the Minister (correspondence dated 27th November), for TUS Election, Nomination and Appointment of Governing Body Members Regulations 2024 subject to three clarifications/amendments, a reply to the Minister has been issued which addresses the clarifications/amendments. In the context of an amendment made to the regulations by the Minister, it was noted that as the Students' Union under the Act selects its three nominees to Governing Body in accordance with their own procedures, it may possibly be the case that the new Governing Body will not meet the 40 per cent gender objective, however all efforts will be made by Students Union to get fair representation.

The Membership Regulation Committee (CMR) had a meeting in December and will meet again in January to progress these matters. It is expected that advertising for external candidates will take place in January and arrangements for internal elections will proceed January/February. Referencing an earlier discussion at the Governing Body, The term of appointment will be varied for a number of the external member appointments in order to address strategic continuity.

9. Action Log

The President gave an update on the recent TUS China visits (the Report has also been uploaded to Decision Time). The President advised that TUS engage in strict criteria and targeted marketing before seeking engagement with international markets and do not operate in a country with no diplomatic involvement. Teaching is the primary market of TUS with universities in China and TUS also have a long standing relationship with China esp. through the Athlone campus. In relation to the Ministry of Education approved programmes in China it was noted that Chinese students can and do attend TUS as part of these programmes.

In relation to TUS students travelling to Europe as part of their programme it was noted that there is a small uptake of TUS students undertaking Erasmus programmes, however, TUS receive many Erasmus students from mainland Europe.

The TUS non-EU international student market has grown by 24% in last year and it is hoped to exceed this percentage in the coming year, however, the main limitation noted is the issue regarding student accommodation.

The following are the current principal markets in which TUS are proactive: China, India, Malaysia, Nigeria, Canada, Mexico and Brazil.

Update on the following items:

Item 99 'Code green' This item is completed and has also been published in Irish.

Items coded 'green' will be removed from the Action Log.

10. Risk Management

Regarding potential budget issues which were previously highlighted, it was advised that some additional funding is expected before the year end. An update will be provided to the Finance & Physical Development Committee meeting in January '24. Regarding International collaboration, human rights and international trade, the President advised that any associated risk reside with the relevant Head of function and that due diligence is carried out before signing all agreements.

Going forward the issue of 'risk' will need to be included on all presentations to Governing Body.

11. TUS Key Strategic Priorities Progress Report and President's Update

The President gave an update on the meeting with Chairs, TU Presidents, An Taoiseach and Minister Harris. The TU Presidents also had a pre-meeting with Colm O'Reardon, (Secretary General of DFHERIS). A number of items were discussed including professorships for TU's and Student Accommodation. The Minister was requested to follow up on a number of issues discussed.

Organisation structure was also discussed at the meeting, TUS is awaiting official sanction to proceed with advertising of the requested posts which will enable TUS to deliver the overall strategy as part of the Strategic Plan priorities.

The TUS Strategic Plan Metrics & Targets Baseline data 20/11/23 is available on the Resource section of Decision Time. The President will present an updated version to the Governing Body in January '24. Updated versions of the Metrics data will be uploaded to the Resource section of Decision Time on an ongoing basis.

According to the most recent HEA Graduate Outcomes Survey, 86.9% of 2022 TUS honours degree graduates are in employment, the highest percentage in the country. The Chair on behalf of the Board congratulated the President and TUS on this wonderful achievement.

In response it was noted that the subsidiary company review, as commissioned by ARC and GB is on-going and due to report to the ARC in February. Clarity on the approval forum and process will form part of the report. Presently the companies Act and the Subsidiary code provide the board of directors approve the financial statements.
