### **Application Process**

- Application Form currently available on the course webpage TUS | Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Education & Care (Flexible Learning Version)
- Deadline for applications applications will close as soon as maximum number is reached.
- Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) including submission of all qualifications (transcripts)
- Must be working in an early years environment for the duration of the programme- 400hrs of professional practice to be completed in Year 1 and Year 2 of Level 7 programme
- Level 7 runs for two academic years
- Academic Year (Sep May)
- 14<sup>th</sup> Sep 2024 Induction in Thurles Campus



### **Course Fees**

- The full fee for this two year programme is €4,800 (€2,400 per annum).
- This programme is eligible for 80% funding under the **Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF)** initiative.
- The Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF) will open to applicants in early May, to create an NSLF account and upload employment details.
- From 1st May 2024, **applicants should email Pobal**, at <u>NSLF@pobal.ie</u> to request a link to the Nurturing Skills Learner Fund Student Portal. Applicants will be required to complete a number of pre-requisite tasks prior to completing the NSLF application process.
- The full NSLF funding application process will open in early June.
- Applicants will be notified of a NSLF funding decision by early July.

- Skills demonstration and possible an exam.
